

Secondary Suite Bylaw

Amendments for Wards 7, 8, 9 and 11

Following Council June 2015:

City Council voted down the proposed bylaw amendments for Wards 7, 8, 9 and 11, including amendments made during the first reading in May, by a 9-6 vote on June 29, 2015. The proposal would have allowed another 35,395 parcels in these Wards to apply for a secondary suite without first rezoning their property.

Despite the outcome 32,333 parcels in these four wards remain eligible for a secondary suite without requiring a Land Use Redesignation approved by City Council. Property owners interested about learning how to apply for a Secondary Suite or Backyard Suite with or without Land Use Designation can visit calgary.ca/ secondarysuites.

What is The Hub?

Message types and user delivery profiles can be tailored to meet the needs and preferences for each registered community member. Legacy funding of up to \$4.4 million for Nose Hill Park has been spent but pathway and trail work is continuing from the Action Plan budget. The Legacy Parks Fund Committee advises City Council about public investment, land opportunities, strategy, and project expenditures. The Mayor, 3 Councillors, the Parks Director, and Program Manager are working Committee members. New members are appointed at the Oct. 19 meeting of Council. An annual report comes through the Council Committee on Community and Protective Services. On the agenda is an overview of the Legacy program, financial update, and report on projects. Legacy Phases 1 & 2 up to \$148 million were for Devonian Gardens, Ralph Klein Park, Open Space, Public Art, IBS Restoration, Bowness Lagoon, Paskapoo, and Bearspaw.

Phase 3 up to \$83 million is for Bowmont E. Regional Park, Douglas Fir Trail, Open Space, Paskapoo Slopes Park, Blakiston Park, Edworthy Park, Confederation Park, Beaverdam Flats Regional Park, and others.

There is now city-wide recruitment for the Off-leash Ambassador Program. The training program will be on animal behaviour from a dog-trainer. Volunteers will promote safety, answer questions, be role models, convey concerns, and promote dog adoption and licensing. The

2nd Annual Working Dogs Day, an event to learn about the role of service dogs, is on Sat. Sept. 19, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Bowmont Park. You can meet community working dogs and their handlers.

Dogs must be on-leash on a paved pathway even in an off-leash area. All City off-leash areas are multi-use and there are 150 such public areas to enjoy. Responsible dog ownership means having your pet under control, especially in off-leash areas. This means able to respond to sight and sound commands. Dogs are not allowed to bite, injure, chase or attack; bark, howl, damage property or animals, scatter garbage.

While on a pathway, the rules are to remain on the righthand side, do not interfere with or obstruct other users, and the leash should be no longer than 2 metres. Dog owners while on a pathway may not cycle, skateboard, or in-line skate with a dog on a leash. Dogs are not permitted on school grounds, playgrounds, sports fields, golf courses, cemeteries, and wading or swimming areas. Fines range from \$25 to \$1500.




A MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNCILLOR DRUH FARRELL WARD 7

Another summer break is behind us, and the little tykes are heading back to school. In Ward 7, many families live close enough to their community schools for the kids to walk or cycle. No matter how they travel, all children will head to and from school during the busiest commute times. Please take extra care on our streets and always be on the look-out for people walking and cycling.

A Parent's Dilemma:

- 1. Speeding traffic is cited as the biggest concern for parents who allow their kids to walk to school.
- According to the Calgary Police Service, busy parents rushing their kids to school are the most common speeding and parking offenders.
- 3. Concerns about traffic hazards often lead more parents to drive their children to school, thereby increasing traffic hazards.



Attentive driving and slower speeds are critical to keeping our neighbourhoods safe. A small reduction in speed can make the difference between life and death. There is a 50/50 chance of surviving if a person walking is hit at 50 kilometres per hour, but at 30km/h the survival rate goes up to 95 per cent.

Earlier this year, City Council took the important step of aligning and expanding school and playground 30km/h zones from 7:30am to 9:00pm. This is just one step toward improving safety for everyone. If you are concerned with the speed of traffic in your neighbourhood, there are several steps you and your community association can take to improve the safety of all road users:

- Post an article in your community or school newsletter to reach many of the people who are driving school routes on a regular basis.
- Place "children at play" signs, sold at major toy stores, in the parking area of the street where children are active.
- Organize a "paint the pavement" street mural to remind drivers to be courteous and behave like guests in your neighbourhood.

PROGRAMS PROGRAMS



It is hard to believe that summer is over and the school year has arrived once again! While back to school normally brings thoughts of studying, tests and school supplies, it also is a great time to think about what extracurricular activities could enrich your child's life.

Did you know that many extracurricular activities provide incredible opportunities for children to enhance their social and emotional literacy (SEL) skills? SEL skills form the backbone of "pro-social" behaviour and include values such as compassion, empathy and respect. There are many ways to foster social and emotional development, including extracurricular activities centered around helping other people or animals. How do these activities help to build pro-social skills? Here are a few examples:

- Empathy Understanding why you are helping requires you to take a walk in somebody else's shoes. Empathy is considered the root of pro-social behaviour and involves the ability to connect with another person (or animal) and understand how they are feeling from that other person's perspective rather than your own. Pro-social behaviors are the behaviors that allow us to build relationships, maintain friendships and connect with our communities. Without empathy, we could not have strong relationships with others.
- Compassion Empathy is a foundation for understanding others, but compassion moves those feelings into action. In acting compassionately, children not only develop concern for others, but they also learn that they can have a profound impact on the community around them and that they play a key role in "creating the world they want to live in".
- Respect When children help they learn more about why other people (and animals) sometimes need help, and why needing help is not a bad thing. One of the most harmful things we can do to someone is to "other" them, yet this happens every day. "Othering" is the

process by which we separate ourselves from another living thing and assign ourselves a special status that prevents us from "being like them". However, when we teach children to help others instead of judging them we foster the values of respect for all living things! In helping animals, children learn that even the smallest fish deserves to have good food and a safe home by virtue of being a living, thinking, feeling being.

How can my child become involved?

Attend a youth program! Attending one of our kids clubs or youth programs is a great way for your child to complete some volunteer tasks in a safe environment with supervision from a trained staff member. Children in our kids clubs and youth programs get to participate in select animal interactions and learn more about the awesome animals that share our world. Our clubs are arranged by age for students aged 8-16.

- Party with a purpose! Check out Calgary Humane Society's birthday party program and spend your next birthday with us! Our experienced staff member will lead your party on a journey to discover more about the needs of animals and the role of CHS in the community. Birthday parties are available for children aged 5-13.
- Collect donations/wish list items Looking to help at home? Host a fundraiser (like a lemonade stand) or collect items from our wishlist (we love old towels!). Don't forget to contact our Humane Education team when your fundraiser is finished, because we would love to say thank you and give you a tour!


