PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear neighbours;

As I write this message in early May for the June edition of The Beacon, there are several important issues that have come to the attention of our community association's board. These issues have long lasting implications and should serve to make us all think about what it is to be a community within the City of Calgary, and the importance of working together to control what our future here will look like. Unfortunately, my crystal ball is on the fritz today so I have no idea what may have transpired by the time you read this.

The first issue concerns a major development proposed just across 16th Avenue in Motel Village. Although this land resides completely within the community of Banff Trail, Briar Hill is only a stone's throw away and this development will directly affect our residents, likely more than most Banff Trail residents.

On April 3rd, 2017, our association first received notice from the city's planning department that way back in 2011, all of Motel Village had gone through an Area Redevelopment Plan to allow 30 to 90 meter, multi-use buildings. Banff Trail has been consulting over the past six months with a developer who has proposed building a 30-storey, 90-meter student residence with adjacent commercial offices and restaurants near the southwest corner.

The April 3rd notice we received was accompanied by a brief apology for having overlooked notifying us and advisement that we would have until May 8 to respond. Since it seemed likely the application would be successful, the developer's application for the 90-meter tower would go on to the Calgary Planning Commission May 18. If successful at this step, construction could start at any time.

Immediately upon receiving notice of this proposed development, our community association and concerned HH-BH residents researched the development, organized an information meeting, and planned a strategy for action to hastily put together some kind of meaningful input and make our voices heard by the City. Our many well composed letters asking for help and an extension were initially turned down by Councillor Farrell's office but on May 2nd we received an email granting us an extension to June 1st! We achieved a positive outcome through our united efforts.

The second issue affecting our community concerns the City's initiative to redevelop 14th Ave, between 14 and 19 Streets. On April 25th, we received an email from Councillor Farrell's office announcing that an initial workshop had been scheduled for May 11th in Rosemont, rather than in our own community association's facility which is located about 100 meters from the actual site. Follow-up workshops were to be held later in May - also scheduled to take place in Rosemont. With a great deal of effort by our board members, these meetings will now be held in our community where they rightfully belong. Again, commitment and effort were rewarded with positive results for our community!

All this just serves to reinforce the importance of working together as a community. As your board of directors, we are working hard to achieve this through improved communication and to engage as many community members as possible. There are a number of ways you can help us keep you informed - Facebook, Twitter, our website (hh-bh.ca), purchasing a community membership or providing us with your contact information so you may receive informative emails directly from us, and of course, by reading this monthly publication, The Beacon.

I would now like to thank the volunteer board members of our association for their dedication, efforts, and commitment to our community and also thank all you residents who step up when needed to help make Hounsfield Heights - Briar Hill such a wonderful place to live. Changes in our community are inevitable and sometimes messy but if we work together and raise a unified voice, we will be able to influence our future and have a say in what those changes are. I am looking forward to the positive changes I believe will result from addressing these issues as a community, and I hope to meet many of you at upcoming events. In the meantime, I hope you are enjoying spring, which should have arrived by now!

An important message to all Hounsfield **Heights-Briar Hill community members**

The City of Calgary is close to approving a proposal to develop a 30-storey tower in Motel Village, directly adjacent to our community of Hounsfield Heights-Briar Hill (HH-BH).

Elements of this proposal have been underway since 2011 but our community was not notified until April 2017. By way of contrast, Banff Trail has been actively consulted regarding this development for over 6 months.

The proposed development includes four floors of commercial development: one floor of restaurants; three medical floors; and a 30-storey residential tower designed for students. The developer is proposing 28 parking spots for students in the residential tower, 28 for visitors, 4 for offices, 91 for medical, and 64 for restaurants.

What impact could this have on HH-BH? Some concerns expressed by members of the community include the following:

- Parking with the potential of over 500 residents, the number of proposed parking stalls is critically low. The number of stalls proposed for commercial purposes is also low. This leads to the potential of overflow parking occurring in our neighbourhood.
- Traffic increased traffic on an already busy corner, and along 16th Avenue, 19th Street, 14th Avenue

· Safety - additional traffic and population increases risk • Privacy - the height of the proposed tower adjacent to our community, which is close to three times higher



than any other development in the area, and allows direct views of resident's properties from upper stories

- Student housing there are concerns that this building will not ultimately be economically viable for student housing, and that it will not remain a student-focused development
- Noise and light pollution

Currently, all signs point to this project being approved. It is critical that we act quickly and cohesively as a community to demand additional time to review and meaningfully engage with the City and the Developer regarding our concerns about this project. There has been a lack of public engagement and inadequate consultation and communication.

Your HH-BH community association and a group of concerned citizens are working hard to gain more information on this proposal and to formulate a plan so that concerned residents can have meaningful input into the City's development process. A letter-writing campaign is underway and meetings are being held with various parties. It is important that residents stay informed and involved through effective communication media.


